Award Requirements:

- Student status: A student enrolled at any college or university is eligible to apply, however, project must be conducted using resources at HMSC. Students admitted for Summer and Fall 2022 are welcome to apply.
- Degree program: Any degree program
- Reporting: Awardees will be required to submit a final report by May 31, 2023
- Awardees will be required to participate in the 2022 and 2023 Markham Symposiums. The 2022 Markham Symposium will be held on June 16, 2022.

Funding Uses:

- Any expenses that contribute to onsite activities at the Hatfield Marine Science Center

To Apply:

Applications must be submitted through the online application form at <https://beav.es/JPd> by 11:45 PM on April 8, 2022 to be considered. Applications should be submitted as a single pdf document.

Your application must include the following documents:

- Cover letter, including the applicant's anticipated dates of being onsite at the Hatfield Marine Science Center.
- Project description, no longer than one page including a summary of activities, projects, or opportunities that would be supported by this fund, including a statement of academic goals in marine studies. It should also address how the project will contribute to the applicant's career goals and aspirations.
